## **Category 1: Foundations** (minimum = 11 credit hours)

# Foundations ground general education.

Foundations provide coursework to develop students' abilities to communicate effectively through writing, to use quantitative reasoning, and to develop global and domestic intercultural knowledge and competence. For each requirement, the majority of the course content and experiences should focus on the common goal.

# Category 2: Pillars<sup>iii</sup> (minimum = 12 credit hours)

## Pillars support breadth of knowledge.

Pillars provide an understanding of knowledge and methods associated with the humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences. Through breadth of knowledge, pillars allow students to explore multiple viewpoints, ideas, and disciplines important for any career. Courses must be accessible for all learners to explore and develop an understanding of broad disciplines important for a liberal arts education.

### Arches span disciplinary perspectives.

Arches enable students to explore breadth of knowledge learning outcomes combined with common goal learning outcomes. Student are encouraged to take courses from a single arch topic.

## Category 4: Bridges<sup>v</sup> (minimum = 4 credit hours)

### Bridges *connect* disciplines to common goals.

Bridges focus explicitly on specific common goal learning outcomes. Course encourage students to build competencies through general education, major, minor, or certificate programs.

Capstones is a capstone course or culminating experience that requires students to integrate and apply what they have learned. Typically offered at the end of a student's educational journey, capstones may be specific to the major, an arch requirement, or combined with a bridges course.
