1. Not open to transfer students.

2. This program leads to a Bachelor of Sport Science degree.

3. Selective admission program. Upon successful completion of the preparatory program requirements, you must complete a separate application for the major program and admission is not guaranteed.

4. Transfer applicants must follow the additional application process outlined on this school or department's website.

5. Students admitted to this program must complete a separate application process during your first year of study before you will be eligible to register for any major-specific courses.

6. Selective admission program. This program leads to a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree.

7. Selective admission program. Upon successful completion of the preparatory program requirements, you must pass the portfolio review at the end of the freshman year to continue as an Interior Architecture major.

8. This program leads to a Bachelor of Arts degree.

9. Selective admission program. This program leads to a Bachelor of Music degree.

10. Selective program. Freshmen apply for full admission at the end of their first year. Transfers refer to instructions.

11. This pre-professional program does not fulfill any degree but is intended as preparation for admission into a professional school or program.

12. You must complete the Pre-Social Work Program and submit a separate application before you can become a social work major.

13. Not open to first-year students. Selective admission doctoral program. Major in a preparatory program such as Biological Sciences/Pre-Physical Therapy or Psychology/Pre-Physical Therapy in the College of Arts and Sciences, or Exercise Physiology in the College of Health Sciences and Professions.
