Project Lead the Way Requirements to Receive Ohio University Credit

Revised November 2010

Ohio University will grant college level credit for secondary school students from certified Project Lead the Way (PLTW) schools who satisfy the following requirements:

First, students must complete the following four PLTW courses with a grade of B or above and who have scored 70 or above on the PLTW Part C (college credit) exam for each course:

1. Introduction to Engineering Design
2. Principles of Engineering
3. Digital Electronics
4. Engineering Design and Development

Second, students must meet the requirements for admission to Ohio University and enroll in the Russ College of Engineering and Technology.

If the previous two conditions are met, the following three (3) courses will be articulated to the student's Ohio University record.

1. ET 280: Engineering and Technology – Overview (4 credit hours)
2. EE 102: Introduction to Computer Engineering (4 credit hours)
3. ETM 101: Engineering Graphics Fundamentals (3 credit hours)

Application of ET 280, EE 102, and ETM 101 towards degree requirements in Russ College vary by degree program within Russ College. ET 280 satisfies a degree requirement in all of the engineering programs. EE 102 is a required course in electrical engineering and computer science. ETM 101 is a required course in industrial technology, mechanical engineering, civil engineering, and industrial and systems engineering.
