Footnotes

1. This pre-professional program does not fulfill any degree but is intended as preparation for admission into a professional school or program.

2. You must complete the Pre-Social Work Program and submit a separate application before you can become a social work major.

3. Not open to transfer students.

4. Transfer applicants must follow the additional application process outlined on this school or department's web site.

5. Program offered jointly by the College of Education and the College of Health and Human Services. The degree awarded is a Bachelor of Science in Education degree, awarded by both colleges.

6. Offered in both the College of Education and the College of Health and Human Services. You may receive teacher licensure regardless of the college in which you enroll.

7. Students admitted to this program must complete a separate application process during your first year of study before you will be eligible to register for any Special Education courses.

8. This program leads to a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree.

9. This program leads to a Bachelor of Arts degree.

10. This program leads to a Bachelor of Music degree.

11. Selective admission program. Upon successful completion of the preparatory program requirements, you must complete a separate application for the major program and admission is not guaranteed.

12. Selective admission program. Upon successful completion of the preparatory program requirements, you must pass the portfolio review to continue as an Interior Architecture major.

13. Not open to first-year students. Selective admission doctoral program. Major in a preparatory program such as Biological Sciences/Pre-Physical Therapy or Psychology/Pre-Physical Therapy in the College of Arts and Sciences, or Exercise Physiology in the College of Health and Human Services. You must apply for the doctoral program through the School of Physical Therapy.

14. Selective program. Freshmen apply for full admission at the end of their first year. Transfers refer to instructions.
