

Ohio University Army ROTC Gains National Recognition During Summer Training

For the eighth consecutive year Ohio University Army ROTC exceeded Cadet Command Averages in all recorded training events. On the average, forty ROTC programs from across the nation are able to accomplish this level of performance every year. Since 2001, Ohio University Army ROTC has exceeded Cadet Command averages in all training events, an accomplishment comparable to an intercollegiate sports program qualifying to compete in the national championships for eight consecutive years. We are the only ROTC program in the nation out of 272 colleges and universities to accomplish this consistent level of performance.



This summer OU was 2nd in the nation with over 68% of our seniors earning overall “Excellence” ratings during LDAC. To put this in perspective, this summer only 21% of the 5,200 Cadets that attended LDAC earned overall “Excellence” ratings. The Bobcat Battalion’s Class of 2009 tripled the national average. In addition, we placed 1st in the Brigade and 11th in the nation in Basic Rifle Marksmanship,

4th in the Brigade and 28th in the nation on the Army Physical Fitness Test, and 4th in the Brigade and 86th in the nation on Land Navigation scores. This was an incredible accomplishment considering that our LDAC attendance doubled in size increasing from 11 Cadets last summer to 22 Cadets this summer.
