### One Time Opportunities:

- I. **Date:** Dec. 4 -13.
  - II. **Description:** The group will work with the New Orleans Rebirth Volunteer Program—a service project of the Greater New Orleans Unitarian Universalists' Center for Ethical Living and Social Justice Renewal. In addition to working to rebuild housing and facilities for community organizations, trip participants will learn about how the politics of race, class, and religion contributed to the severity of the problems and continue to impact the effort to restore this unique American community. Participants will leave by van from Athens on December 4, and return on December 13. Cost of the trip will be \$450 per person, which includes travel, lodging, and meals while in New Orleans; some assistance with fundraising is available. Registration for the trip starts now, and the deadline for forms and \$250 deposit is October 15.

They utilize volunteers Monday - Friday from 7am until 1 p.m. They will open on Saturday mornings for a committed Group. Volunteers pack and prepare food for the Backpack Kids program, which provides weekly lunches to over 1000 kids and the Build a Boxes for Senior Program which provides food to over 4000 seniors per month.

- **Weatherization Program – Contact Greg Andrews at 740-753-3062.**

Individual or small groups of volunteers are needed to assist work crews that weatherize homes in a tri-county area. Crews go out during the day Monday – Friday to assist low to moderate income families. The goal is to weatherize 450 homes over the next 20 months including air leakage reduction and insulation. The average saving to home owners is a 30% reduction to energy consumptions.
