| <p>OCOM 610</p> | <p>Medical Knowledge: Gastrointestinal NEW (Abbreviated Title: Gastrointestinal); Replaces OCOM 669R; Instruction Code: 5; GEC: 5; Credit Hrs.: 7; Lect.Hrs.: 13; Lab Hrs.: 2; Repeatable: Y; Max Credit Hrs.: 7; Retakable: N; Max No. of Times: n/a; Prerequisite: Offered only to OUCOM 1st Year students; Instructor: Peter Coshigano, Ph.D.; Course Description: This five-week course introduces students to the diagnosis, treatment & prevention of gastrointestinal diseases & disorders. These concepts will be derived from the study of the disciplines of clinical medicine, anatomy, microanatomy, embryology, physiology, pharmacology, microbiology, immunology, biochemistry, nutrition, pathology, & public health as they relate to the gastrointestinal system and to engage students in the use of the above concepts as a scientific basis for medical decision-making. The focus is on History & Physical Exams (H&P), Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) skills and Clinical & Community Experiences (CCE). Integral to all of these areas are psychosocial skills. Other components will guide the student in learning specific psychomotor skills, as well as reinforce the importance of an evidence-based approach to the clinical application of medicine.
