

## PROGRAMS COMMITTEE REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 2011 UCC

### Non Q2S business

#### **High School Articulation Documents**

These documents were prepared by Director of Articulation Services (Carissa Anderson) and discussed in meetings with the EPSA chair, the UCC chair and the UCC programs chair, and it was decided that the programs committee should review them and make a recommendation to UCC. The PC did review the high school articulation policies and procedures and recommends approval by UCC.

#### **Program Change: Degree Designation Change for the Graduate Program in Athletic Administration at Ohio University**

The purpose of this proposal is to change the *name of the degree* awarded to students who successfully complete the graduate athletic administration program of study. The current degree name is Master of Science in Recreation and Sport Sciences (MS-RSS); the proposed degree name is Master of Science in Athletic Administration (MS-AA). This proposal to change the *name of the degree* is necessitated by the fact that athletic administration program of study has been realigned with the College of Business.

#### **Program Change: Bachelor of Business Administration with a Major in Sports Administration**

This is a proposal submitted by the faculty of the Department of Sports Administration (DSA) for adding a Sports Administration major under the existing Bachelor of Business Administration or acronymized as BBA in Sports Ad. The DSA faculty hope to start the program in Fall 2011.

#### **Program Change: Degree Designation Change for the Graduate Program in Family Studies (MS 6351) and Child Development and Family Studies (MS 6402) at Ohio University**

The purpose of this proposal is to change the *name of the degree* awarded to students who successfully complete the graduate degrees in Family Studies and in Child Development and Family Studies program of study. There are currently 2 major codes for the graduate programs in Family Studies. We propose to change the current 2 into 1 degree name. The current degrees in the Family Studies graduate program are: 1) Master of Science in Family Studies (MS 6351) and 2) Master of Science in Child Development and Family Studies (MS 6402); the proposed degree name is Master of Science in Child and Family Studies (MS-CFS). This proposal to change the *name of the degree* is necessitated by the fact that family studies program of study has been realigned with the Department of Social and Public Health in the College of Health Sciences and Professions. The degree name graduate students currently receive is a Master of Science in Human and Consumer Sciences. The new degree designation will be a Master of Science in Child and Family Studies.

#### **Program Change: Degree Designation Change for the Graduate Program in Speech-Language Pathology at Ohio University**

The purpose of this proposal is to change the *Master of Arts in Hearing, Speech and Language Sciences* awarded to students who successfully complete the graduate speech-language pathology program of study. The current degree name is *Master of Arts in Hearing, Speech and Language Sciences* (MA-HSLS); the proposed degree name is *Master of Arts in Speech Language Pathology* (MA-SLP). This proposal to change the *Master of Arts in Hearing, Speech and Language Sciences* is necessitated by the fact that the speech-language pathology program of study has been realigned with School of Rehabilitation and Communication Sciences as well as better reflecting the specific discipline to which the degree is dedicated.

**Program Change: Degree Designation Change for the Undergraduate Program in Family Studies (BS 6351) at Ohio University**

The purpose of this proposal is to change the *name of the degree* awarded to students who successfully complete the undergraduate degree in Family Studies. The degree name students currently receive is a Bachelor of Science in Human and Consumer Sciences (BS-HCS). The requested degree designation is Bachelor of Science in Child and Family Studies (BS-CFS). This proposal to change the *name of the degree* is necessitated by the fact that family studies program of study has been realigned with the Department of Social and Public Health in the College of Health Sciences and Professions.

**Program Change: Degree Designation Change for the Graduate Program in Food and Nutrition Sciences at Ohio University**

The purpose of this proposal is to change the *name of the degree* awarded to students who successfully complete the graduate food and nutrition program of study. The current degree name is Master of Science in Human and Consumer Sciences (MS-HCS); the proposed degree name is Master of Science in Food and Nutrition Sciences (MS-FNS). This proposal to change the *name of the degree* is necessitated by the fact that the nutrition program of study has been realigned with the School of Health Sciences and Wellness (a new school).

**Program deletion: MS6350 -EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**

DELETE MS6350

Admissions have been suspended as of Summer 2010 and final graduates of this program are anticipated Summer 2012. Students interested in this area will be served by the existing MEd in Curriculum & Instruction. MS6350 was based on the idea of having a Child and Family Studies department that would share a master's degree as part of a School of Human and Consumer Sciences. With the breakup of the Child and Family Studies program area, the child development classes moved to the Patton College of Education and Human Services and the Child Life and Family Studies aspects of the program stayed in the new College of Health Sciences. Students who wish a master's degree in Early Childhood Education to focus on aspects of Child Development have more choices now that the program is part of PCEHS. Early Childhood professionals who choose to continue their professional development will have a specific ECE track in the C&I masters program that draws on the resources of other PCEHS programs. There were few ECE majors in MS6350 and those that were in the program can be easily transitioned into the C&I program. The resources offered by being a part of the Teacher Education Department will enhance recruitment and of graduate students.
