CHAIRS REPORT: Elizabeth Sayers

Sayers called the eighth and final meeting of 2010-2011 to order at 3:51p.m.

Sayers introduced herself as the new chair of the University Curriculum Council and welcomed everyone present to the final meeting of the 2010-2011 academic year. She thanked everyone, especially the Committee Chairs, for their hard work during the past year to complete the curriculum Q2S transition.

Sayers informed the Council that vacancies will be filled over the summer.

Sayers informed the Council that a draft outlining the Junior Level Equivalency Courses under semesters will be presented at Faculty Senate for first reading. If the resolution passes, the Council will be responsible for developing a system of monitoring the JE and the J courses.

Sayers informed the Council that the Q2S Steering group will be meeting on an as needed basis over the summer. They are working on scheduling issues and transitions guidelines.

Sayers called for approval of the May 10, 2011 minutes. Reilly moved, James seconded. Minutes approved unanimously by voice vote.

INDIVIDUAL COURSE COMMITTEE: Anita James, Chair

James presented the minutes from the June, 2011 meeting.

James amended the minutes. The Wolof courses are not repeatable.

PROGRAMS COMMITTEE: Greg Kremer, Chair

First Reading

- OU Math-KAU Joint Degree
 - Students will spend their first year at King Abdulaziz University, Saudi Arabia taking traditional mathematics subjects.
 - The second year will be at Ohio University taking applied and computational mathematics subjects.
 - They will fulfill the requirements of the applied track in the masters program in mathematics at OU.
 - Concern was raised about the equal treatment of females to males.
 - Stipulation as to the what the degree will be, what will appear on the transcription, what will the diploma look like.
 - The program will need to go to RAGGS as an expedited program

Second Reading

- Q2S-PH7259 Mechanical and Systems Engineering PhD Program
 - Was left out of ENTD college binder
 - Approved unanimously by voice vote

- Program Relocation
 - Language courses from Linguistics to International Studies in the College of Arts and Sciences.
 - SUDN instead of SUDA should be listed
 - Approved unanimously by voice vote

- Program Relocation
 - Social Work to be aligned with the Department of Social and Public Health in the College of Health Sciences and Professions
 - Clarification memo of concerns raised is attached to the proposal
 - OR6602 Minor is added to the relocation by friendly amendment
 - Approved by voice vote with 1 opposition and 1 abstention

- IIP Program Proposal
 - Written documentation of Graduate Council approval has been received
 - Significantly different program from the one that was suspended
 - A review will be done in three years
 - Admission will be contingent upon the formation of the student's committee.
 - Approved by voice vote with 1 opposition
