

Project/Research Papers

If you are working on a project or research paper (note: any final work that is *not* a thesis or dissertation), please contact your advisor or department for details regarding its processing, formatting, printing, and content requirements. Some departments may only require that you format this document into your discipline specific citation style (example: APA, MLA, Chicago). Some also have a standard cover page required and/or a form for the actual filing of the document.

TAD Services does not process any variation of a project or research paper. However, our Web site (www.ohio.edu/tad) may be helpful in assisting a student who has the option of filing a thesis or a project/research paper to decide what paper type he or she wants to pursue. Please notice that the required formatting and filing processes for a thesis are often much more tedious and detailed. However, students filing a project or paper may find some helpful tips on the TAD Services Web site, such as formatting professional looking tables and figures, creating landscape pages, deciding on page order, etc.

If you are interested in learning more about formatting in a specific reference style (APA, MLA, Chicago, etc.), avoiding plagiarism, or how to write a thesis, you have several options. Our TAD Services Web site (www.ohio.edu/tad, under Step 1) and the Alden Library Web site (<http://www.library.ohiou.edu/find/style.html>) have information on these topics.
