To the Ohio University Students in Hong Kong:

Earlier this year, in response to your concerns about the status of our undergraduate degree program in Hong Kong, I expressed my personal commitment, as well as that of the University, to all of our students in Hong Kong that each of you will have an opportunity to complete your degree in as effective and efficient a manner as possible. To this end, I have asked our Dean of Lifelong Learning to develop a schedule of classes that would be available to you through the 2008 Fall term. This schedule will be posted on the Hong Kong Program web site, and it also will be made available for students to pick up at our office on the campus of Hong Kong Baptist University.

The schedule will list on-site as well as on-line classes, and it will include courses for each of the majors we offer in Hong Kong so that students can have sufficient opportunity to meet their program requirements. In addition, following the phase-out of on-site classes at the end of next year, you can be assured that our commitment to you will continue, as we will make available to those who still have courses to complete our full listing of on-line and independent study classes, all of which are equivalent to any of our on-site offerings and will meet all of the "residency" requirements of the academic colleges.

All of us at Ohio University recognize our commitment to you and to assisting you in the completion of your degree. We also value our long-standing partnership with Baptist University, and we will continue to work collaboratively with that institution to maintain our strong presence in the region. You, along with all of our alumni in Hong Kong, are an essential part of that presence.
