Criteria for Award of the Kennedy Lecture Series Grants:

- The speaker should be nationally/globally recognized, pre-eminent in their field.
- The speaker should be willing to lecture and to participate in other activities that serve to enrich the lives of members of the university and Athens communities (example: visiting a local school or participating in class discussions).
- The speaker should appeal to a broad cross-section of the university community, bringing new and stimulating thoughts on major public issues of the day, cultural affairs, important scientific issues, or scholarly fields of general interest.
- Lectures funded by the Kennedy Lecture Series must be open to the wider campus community. Demonstrations or class meetings should be open to all who are interested.

Lectures that demonstrate the following will be given priority:

- Lectures that allow for sustained interaction between the speaker and the campus community.
- Lectures where two or more units are collaborating on the lecture. (This could be academic units, student organizations and or administrative units.)
- In any given year, the Committee will strive for a balance among different kinds of subject matters.

Monetary Amount:

The amount of money available for co-sponsorship grants varies from year to year. Grants are awarded in amounts ranging \$500 - \$1000. The organization requesting the grant must invest as much as or more than the Kennedy Lecture Series.

Submission Deadlines:
