



Graduate Assistantships in Music

For the 2012-2013 academic year

DUTIES

Depending on the candidate's skills, duties may include teaching applied lessons, group piano, instrumental or vocal methods, fundamentals-music theory for non majors, music theory tutoring, jazz studies, and music history/literature courses. Candidates may also accompany, assist with conducting and/or performing in chamber music and large ensembles [vocal-instrumental-jazz-classical], and/or serve as an office assistant with various responsibilities.

Applicants may contact the area coordinators to discuss auditions and assistantships.

COMPENSATION

All students awarded a Graduate Assistantship in Music receive stipends ranging from \$5,205 to \$10,413 [2011-12 rates] as well as a complete tuition waiver. Tuition scholarships are also available for summer terms before and after the period covered by the assistantship appointments. Renewals for a second year are offered to students who make satisfactory progress toward degree completion, with the recommendation of the area coordinator.

QUALIFICATIONS

Completion of an appropriate undergraduate degree in music or its equivalent; excellent performance and academic skills is required. Previous teaching experience is highly desirable; Candidates must achieve full acceptance into the School of Music and the University.

DEGREES

The School of Music awards the Master of Music [MM] in composition, conducting [choral-orchestral-wind], music education, music history-literature, music theory, music therapy, performance [orchestral instruments, organ, piano and voice], and performance-pedagogy.

AUDITIONS

An in-person audition is required for admittance as a major and assistantship consideration. Applicants should contact the area coordinator for audition information per instrument or degree. In rare cases, applicants who are unable to audition in person may submit a video or compact disc with prior permission. **Applicants may also arrange individual auditions with the proper area coordinator.** Audition dates for 2012-2013 are:
