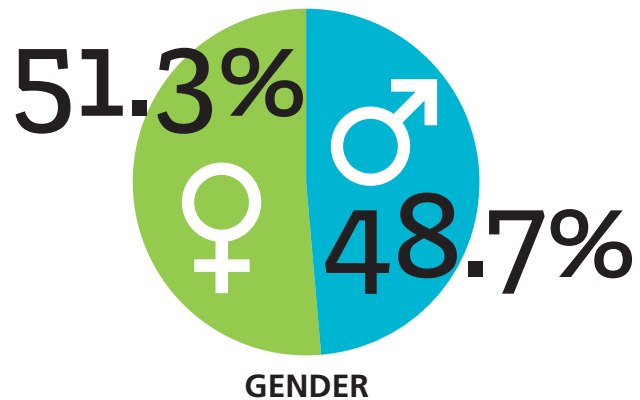
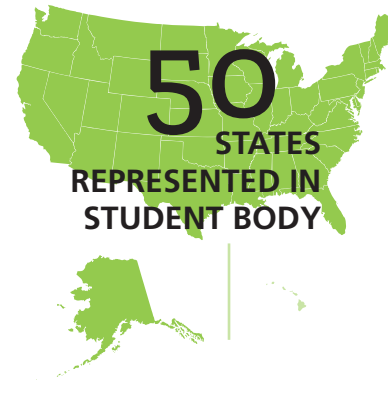

Ohio University's Marching 110—The Most EXCITING Band in the Land—celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2017 with the largest alumni band turnout ever for Homecoming Weekend and also a special performance in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade.



In 1824, Ohio University became a national leader in diversity and inclusion by admitting our first African American student, nearly 40 years before the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. In the decades to follow, Ohio University would continue to lead by emphasizing diversity as a strength when we celebrated our first female graduate in 1873 and our first international student graduate in 1895. Today, we still value a supportive, inclusive environment across all the campuses of Ohio University.

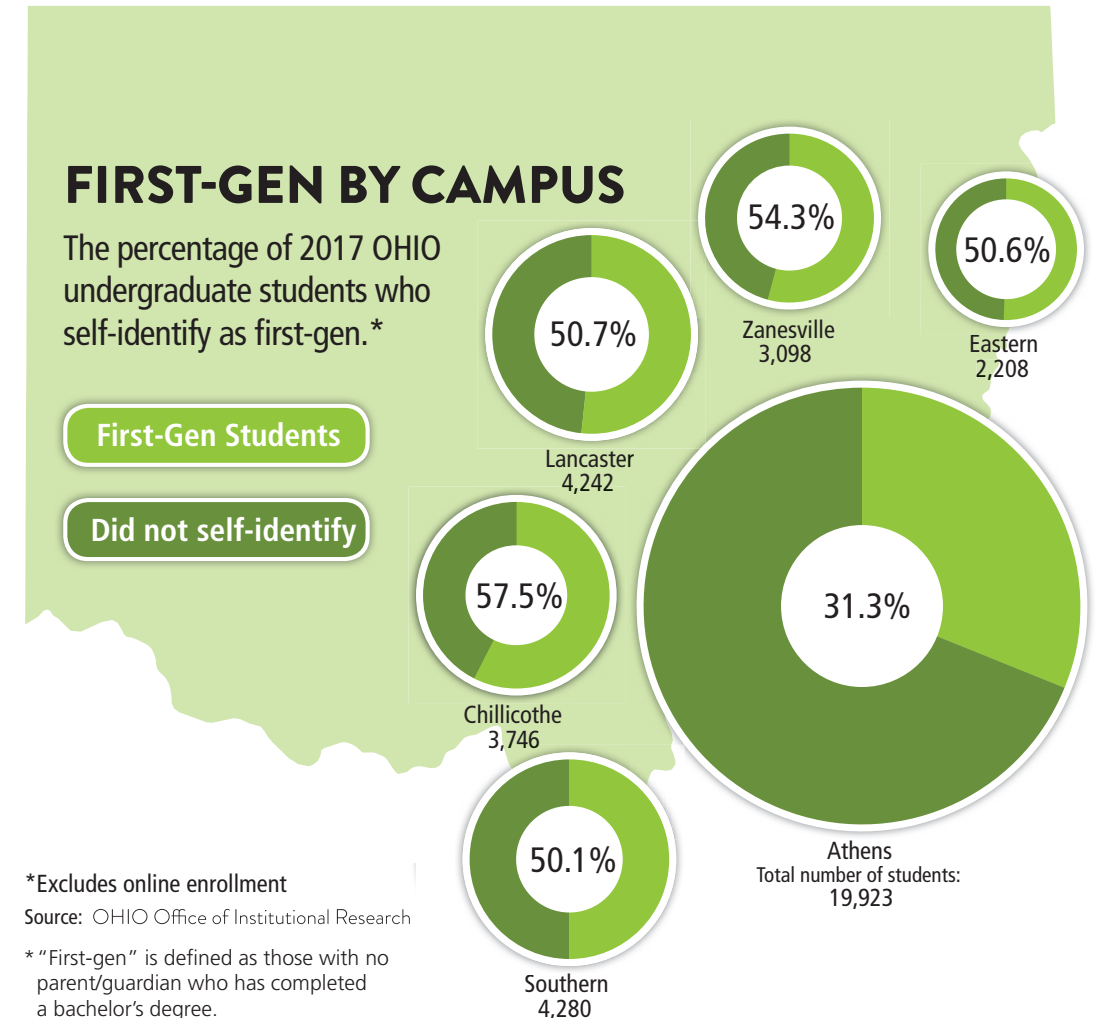

Where we grow

Ohio University's physical footprint in the state expands from the main campus in Athens to five regional campuses, two extension campuses, and two centers. Each campus and center is unique, serving as hubs of employment, education, and culture in their respective communities, yet all are distinctively OHIO. Our campuses and centers provide convenient, statewide access to academic excellence in a smaller, more familiar atmosphere. Students are able to complete 15 Ohio University baccalaureate degrees or 18 associate's degrees at the regional campuses or begin coursework toward any of OHIO's more than 250 academic programs.

Innovative leadership in long-term financial issues management

Ohio University has been nationally recognized for its innovative leadership in managing long-term financial issues. We were the first in the state to offer a four-year pricing guarantee that allows our students and their parents to better budget for college. Today, many other peer institutions in Ohio have adopted the model, and, in the summer of 2017, the Ohio General Assembly provided incentives for all state institutions to pursue their own tuition guarantee programs.
