The School of Rehabilitation and Communication Sciences intends to offer a three-year baccalaureate degree route to students pursuing a major in Communication Sciences and Disorders. This option will be open to students who complete 23 hours of elective credit spread out over two summer terms or through advanced placement or concurrent enrollment credit completed while in high school. Other students will also be able to pursue this degree in a four-year time frame.

The curriculum outlined below is a semester-by-semester plan of study for the Communication Sciences and Disorders major in adherence to section 3333.71 of the Revised Code for the three-year baccalaureate degrees. This plan described a path that includes the summer enrollment option. Please Review this document to gain a better understanding of program requirements.

The scheduling scenario below is intended to present an example pattern by which this major can be completed in three years. Those interested in pursuing this option need to work with an academic advisor to develop a specific plan to earn the 120 credit hours required for graduation.
