Residency Questionnaire

The Residency Questionnaire is provided to assist you in determining if you **may** qualify for in-state tuition based on law established by the Ohio legislature. Official residency decisions are made by Undergraduate Admissions and the Graduate College only after the receipt of an official residency application and supporting documentation.

1. Are you a graduate of an Ohio high school?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for reclassification under the "Forever Buckeye" provision. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 2.
2. Have you, your parent/legal guardian, or spouse been a resident of one of the following Kentucky counties (Boyd, Carter, Elliot, Fleming, Greenup, Lawrence, Lewis, Mason or Rowan), consecutively for the past 12 months?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for Kentucky Tuition Reciprocity agreement (Athens and Southern campuses only). <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 3.
3. On whom are you financially dependent? Who provides at least 51% of your financial support? (Please select only one.)	<input type="checkbox"/> Self. Proceed to question 4. <input type="checkbox"/> Parent(s) or legal guardian. Go to question 5. <input type="checkbox"/> Spouse. Proceed to question 5. <input type="checkbox"/> Other. Proceed to question 5.
4. Are you currently on active duty or a veteran of the United States military?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. Proceed to question 6. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 10.
5. Is the person checked in Question three on active duty or a veteran of the United States military?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. Proceed to question 6. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 12.
6. Is the person checked in Question three a member of the Ohio National Guard?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-8 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 7.
7. Is the person checked in Question three on active military duty both stationed and residing in Ohio?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-3 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 8.
8. Is the person checked in Question three a current Ohio resident serving in the military?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-2 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 9.
9. Is the person checked in Question three described by one of the following?: (a) a veteran who resided in Ohio on the first day of the term for which you are applying for in-state residency and either served one or more years on active duty and was honorably discharged or received a medical discharge due to military related service or (b) the spouse or dependent of a deceased veteran or a or a veteran who has been declared missing in action or a prisoner of war?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the C-4 rule. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Based on the answers you provided above, you are not eligible for instate residency. You may be eligible if you are a part-time student under Residency Exception E-1, or wait 12 months and reapply.

(Part-time is defined as an undergraduate student taking less than 12 credit hours per term and for a graduate student taking less than 6 credit hours per term. Full-time is an undergraduate student taking at least 12 credit hours per term and a graduate student taking at least 8 credit hours per term.)</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Part-time. You may qualify for the E-1 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> Full-time. Proceed to question 11.</p>
<p>11. Have you lived in Ohio consecutively for the past 12 months?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the C-2 rule. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 15.</p>
<p>12. Did the person checked in Question three claim you for tax purposes in the previous tax year (parent/legal guardian/spouse)?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. Proceed to question 13. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Based on the answers you provided above, you are not eligible for instate residency. You may be eligible if you are a part-time student under Residency Exception E-1, or wait 12 months and reapply.</p>
<p>13. Has the person checked in Question three been living in Ohio consecutively for the past 12 months?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the C-1 rule. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 14.</p>
<p>14. Is the person checked in Question three currently residing in Ohio and employed on a full-time basis in Ohio?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the C-3 rule. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 15.</p>
<p>15. Is the person checked in Question three currently an Ohio resident who has been transferred by the employer beyond the territorial limits of the United States and has satisfied his/her Ohio tax obligation?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-4. Exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 16.</p>

Is the person checked in Question three a migrant worker who has been employed in the state of Ohio at least four months during the three years preceding the proposed enrollment?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-5 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 17.</p>
<p>17. Is the person checked in Questions three a community service worker – an Ohio resident who took a position working for the Peace Corps, AmeriCorps or similar program as determined by the Ohio Board of Regents, or an elected or appointed public official who lives outside Ohio for a period of time not exceeding 24 consecutive months returns to Ohio?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-6 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Proceed to question 18.</p>
<p>18. Is the person checked in Question three a person who has returned to Ohio, who has taken legal steps to end a marriage and reestablish financial dependence upon a parent or legal guardian who is an Ohio resident?</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. You may qualify for the E-7 exception. <input type="checkbox"/> No. Based on the answers you provided above, you are not eligible for instate residency. You may be eligible if you are a part-time student under Residency Exception E-1, or wait 12 months and reapply.</p>
