Application Process

Undergraduate Admissions operates on a holistic, selective review and looks for evidence of academic preparation in a strong college-preparatory curriculum when reviewing applications for admission. We consider the following criteria: strength of curriculum, performance in curriculum, class rank, grade-point average, and ACT and/or SAT scores (if provided).

Ohio University offers a test-optional pathway for admission to the Athens campus. Learn more at ohio.edu/admissions/apply/test-optional. If you choose to submit SAT (school code 1593) or ACT (school code 3314) scores, they must be submitted directly from the testing agency or from your high school.

Ohio University is a member of The Common Application, which opens annually in August at commonapp.org. Learn more at ohio.edu/admissions/apply.

Scholarships

All first-year students who are new to the Athens campus of Ohio University in fall 2024 are eligible for consideration for scholarships at OHIO. The application for admission serves as the application for merit-based scholarships. Fall 2024 first-year students with complete applications by the Early Action Deadline of November 15 will be considered automatically.

Eligibility is based on the following:

- · Academic merit as demonstrated by strength of curriculum and cumulative high school grade-point average.
- High school GPA (weighted or unweighted) received by Ohio University by February 15, 2024. We may continue to award using updated credentials on an individual basis throughout the year.
- . Either the highest composite ACT or combined SAT total from any test date received by Ohio University by March 1, 2024, if students choose to submit standardized test scores as part of the application for admission. Students who do not submit a test score will be eligible for scholarship consideration.
- For some awards, special academic or geographic contributions.

We also offer scholarships that recognize talent in the College of Fine Arts. Certain highly competitive scholars programs include generous financial support, and additional scholarships for continuing students are available to recognize outstanding academic achievement at OHIO. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which serves as the application for all federal, state and institutional financial aid at OHIO, is available beginning December 2023. Regional Campus Enrollment Policy

OHIO regional campuses have an open admission policy for high school graduates. Admission is based on an official high school transcript or equivalent. Standardized test scores (Accuplacer, ACT or SAT) are not required for admission. Accuplacer scores may be used for course placement.

2023-2024 Regional Campus Tuition and Fees

During the 2023-2024 academic year, Ohio residents who enroll full-time through one of OHIO's regional campuses will pay \$3,089 per semester, which includes tuition and fees. Because the OHIO Guarantee+ includes all regional campuses, the cost of tuition and fees will remain locked in for 12 consecutive semesters (including summers). Please note that entering in summer prevents freshmen from fully participating in new student orientation, disqualifies them from consideration for most scholarships and may affect the Financial Aid Offer.

Application Process

Applying to an Ohio University regional campus is easy! Complete the Ohio University regional campus application for admission at **ohio.edu/apply**.

We strongly recommend submitting all application materials two weeks prior to the start of the term to ensure sufficient time for processing, new student orientation and registration.

Scholarships

Students who apply for admission to any Ohio University campus are automatically considered for OHIO first-year student scholarships.

OHIO offers scholarship programs designed specifically for regional campus students who apply by December 1, 2023.

- The OHIO Regional Advantage Awards program offers a set of renewable scholarships and awards for first-year, degree-seeking students who are new to an Ohio University regional campus for fall 2024.
- The OHIO Regional Promise is a renewable award that covers the full cost of tuition and mandatory fees to attend an Ohio University regional campus for fall 2024 incoming full-time, Pell-eligible freshmen with a minimum 3.0 high school GPA whose FAFSA is received by the published deadline.
