OVERVIEW

What is Kids in College?

Kids in College is a summer enrichment program for students who are interested in science, history, theatre and many other educational opportunities. The program is staffed by a variety of enthusiastic, imaginative teachers and college faculty who are interested in working with motivated students. The program is sponsored by Ohio University Chillicothe, coordinated by the Ross Pike County Educational Service District and OUC and housed by Chillicothe City Schools.

Who May Attend?

Students who are highly motivated to participate in summer learning in a relaxed, fun environment. Most classes offered for students who have completed kindergarten through 8th grade. Class descriptions offer specific grade recommendations. Please check these recommendations carefully.

How are Classes Scheduled?

Students may take up to 2 classes per week. Each class runs one week, either in the morning or afternoon. A minimum of 12 students is needed to ensure each class is offered. It is recommended that students register early since class enrollment is limited to 20 students or less in some instances.

What is the Cost?

The cost of the first class is 40 dollars and each additional class is 30 dollars. Some classes require additional material fees. Please check the class description for additional fee requirements. A Kids in College tee shirt is included with the course registration. Your child will be enrolled when payment is received.

What about Lunches, Snacks and Bathroom Breaks?

Your child may pack a lunch if he or she will be staying for the afternoon session. The lunch room will be supervised. Students should also pack a drink since vending machines will be unavailable. Snack and bathroom breaks will be taken mid morning and mid afternoon. If your child wants a snack please be sure to pack them since vending machines are not available.

Orientation

A parent and student orientation will be held in the Chillicothe Middle School Commons at 9:15 and noon on the Monday of week 2. Walk into the front doors of CMS and the commons will be to the right.

For weeks 1 and 3, students should meet at the class location given in the registration booklet.
