Dr. Luke Pittaway is an established academic in the field of entrepreneurship. He was awarded USASBE's Entrepreneurship Educator of the Year in 2018, became a USASBE Justin G. Longenecker Fellow in 2022 and was awarded Ohio University Presidential Research Scholar Award in 2023. He is the Copeland Professor of Entrepreneurship at Ohio University (OU) and Director of Innovation in the College of Business. At OU he also served as Associate Dean for Graduate and Undergraduate Programs, as the Chair of the Department of Management and was previously the Director of the Center for Entrepreneurship. He has proven his ability as an 'academic leader' having led a large department and having started and led Centers for Entrepreneurship at universities in the United States (US) and the United Kingdom (UK). He is an internationally renowned scholar in entrepreneurship education and learning and with other research interests in entrepreneurial behavior; networking; failure; growth and, corporate venturing.
