



Physical Activity & Wellness (PAW) Program Graduate Teaching Assistantship

Students pursuing a graduate degree in either Coaching Education or Parks, Recreation, and Leisure Studies can apply for graduate teaching assistantships (GTA). More information on this position, detailed qualifications, and application requirements can be found below. Applications received by **February 1st** receive priority and are reviewed following admissions decisions.

Position Description:

This is a nine-month term appointment requiring a commitment of 20 hours/week, including office hours. The successful candidate will be responsible for (1) teaching activity-based courses in the Physical Activity & Wellness (PAW) program, (2) assisting in the management and maintenance of program equipment and supplies, (3) maintaining accurate course and risk management records, (4) providing general service to the program and department, and (5) serving as a positive role model for undergraduate students. The successful candidates will be expected to participate in a GTA orientation program before the start date of the academic year.

Qualifications:

GTA's receive a full tuition waiver, plus a stipend of \$13,000.
