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## Technology Requirements – Fall, 2020

The following hardware, accessories, and software are required for successful participation and completion of studio coursework in the Interior Architecture program at Ohio University starting in the Fall semester of 2020.

Design professionals increasingly utilize technology to explore and create as part of the design process and as practicing professionals. The industry standard for interior design and architecture has traditionally been the PC but a Mac can also be used. Because not all industry-standard software used by design professionals is available on a Mac, those who chose to use a Mac will need to utilize Bootcamp on their Mac in order to download and run software.

Bootcamp is a boot utility which allows the user to essentially create a PC side to their Mac. When deciding on a platform, it is important to note:

- in a Bootcamp scenario, the computer must be restarted each time the user needs/wants to switch between the Mac side and the PC side (it is like having two different computers housed in one machine)
- If you choose a Mac, you will need to use Bootcamp to partition your hard drive and install Windows 10 on the PC side in order to download and use software

There are several options when purchasing technology so be sure to select hardware that is compatible. The list below is meant as a guide, not as a definitive and specific list. For laptop purchases, the listed options represent optimal, minimum requirements for coursework performance. Purchasing greater sizes or system capabilities in any category is always an option, but anything below the minimum will compromise a system's performance given the coursework demands and may prevent the use of required software/software capabilities.

- I. Laptop
  - a. PC Option
    - i. Any of the current Bobcat Depot Lenovo models
  - b. Mac Option
    - i. suggested Bobcat Depot System F or G
    - ii. you will also need to purchase Windows 10 and install via Bootcamp

A 27" external monitor will expand the visual desktop to make detail work easier and more efficient. The monitor will also assist in the presentation of work to classmates and faculty during critiques. There are a number of high- quality monitors available. Be sure to purchase the necessary cables/adaptors to work with the corresponding laptop.
