Curriculum Development and Revision

COMS 3400JE: *Introduction to Health Communication*. Substantially revised the course to meet University criteria for junior equivalent (JE) writing courses. The course now includes significant writing assignments that apply course concepts as well as instruction on writing. Obtained School, College and University approval for the revised course, 2012.

COMS 780K/7900: *Health Communication Campaigns*. Developed a new graduate course that explores the theory and practice of communication campaigns. The course also focuses on values and ethical dilemmas in the design and conduct of campaigns.

COMS 7900/6100: *Measurement & Preliminary Analyses of Quantitative Data*. Developed a new graduate course that focuses on conceptual and practical skills in quantitative research. The measurement portion of the class focuses on conceptual and operational definitions as well as evaluating these definitions via techniques including reliability, exploratory factor analysis, and confirmatory factor analysis. The preliminary analysis portion of the course focuses on diagnosing and resolving problems encountered when preparing raw data for substantive analyses.

COMS 301/3520: *Empirical Research Applications in Communication*. Substantially revised the course to include both social scientific research methods as well as major statistical techniques. Previously the focus had only been on statistics. The newly revised course provides students an opportunity to design a study, collect data, and analyze results. No approval needed for this revision, 2011.
