Ohio University's Division of Student Affairs comes down to two words — we care. We exist to educate and empower students, to foster inclusive communities and make OHIO strong. With 12 departments, more than 300 professional and graduate-level staff and 2,000+ undergraduate student employees, the team aims to support and challenge students to discover their potential and make a meaningful impact in the world. The Division offers a wide array of activities, services, and opportunities designed to help students get involved and grow as student leaders, both on campus and off.

The Division's portfolio currently includes the Bobcat Depot, Campus Involvement Center, Community Standards & Student Responsibility, Conference & Event Services, Counseling & Psychological Services, Culinary Services, The Office of the Dean of Students, Housing & Residence Life, Sorority & Fraternity Life, Survivor Advocacy Program, Well-Being & Recreation, and The Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs. With oversight of 2.4M square feet of space and a total budget exceeding \$93M, the Division of Students plays a critical role at Ohio University.

Following a 15-month strategic planning process, the Division launched a **strategic plan** in 2018 that continues to guide decision-making, informs investments, and directs the day-to-day work of Division staff. The three key breakthrough objectives include: Equity and Social Justice, Learning Goals, and Retention and Graduation. During the spring and summer of 2021, the Division embarked on a strategic plan refresh, primarily utilizing a well-being framework. Bobcat Depot

Located in Baker University Center, at the heart of campus, The Bobcat Depot is OHIO's shop for technology, gifts, and apparel. It connects the university community and campus visitors to superior tech at educational pricing, provides on-site tech support, and a wide variety of products and services.

Campus Involvement Center

A hub of student life, the Campus Involvement Center provides opportunities for students to connect with one another through programs, student organizations, leadership and experiences that foster practical application of classroom learning.

Community Standards & Student Responsibility

Through the conduct review process, Community Standards & Student Responsibility provides meaningful opportunities for students to learn what it means to be a member of the Ohio University community, addressing individual and organizational misconduct according to the student code of conduct.



Conference & Event Services

Creating memorable experiences for OHIO faculty, staff, students, and the surrounding communities is the mission of Conference & Event Services. It provides outstanding customer service and innovative event solutions for major university events, on-going programs, and visiting conferences.



Counseling & Psychological Services

Mental health and adjustment services are offered by Counseling & Psychological Services. In addition to counseling, group therapy, workshops and support for students, the department also offers consultation to faculty, administrators, and parents of students.

Culinary Services

OHIO's Culinary Services is one of the largest self-operated college dining services in the nation. It aims to provide the finest quality food and service at reasonable cost to students and guests on campus. The department operates 19 venues including cafes, dining halls, and markets.

The Office of the Dean of Students

The Dean of Students advocates for students, coordinates response to student crises, and provides outreach and engagement to parents and families. It aims to advance the university mission of supporting the intellectual and personal development of OHIO students through ongoing advocacy and care through such programs as the Student Review & Consultation Committee, Bobcats Helping Bobcats and the Margaret Boyd Scholars Program.

Housing & Residence Life

As one of the largest departments at OHIO, Housing & Residence Life is responsible for the overall operation and administration of all campus housing, the university's residential education program, and on-campus student enrichment and engagement.

Sorority & Fraternity Life

More than 175 years ago the first Greek organization was chartered at OHIO. Today, Sorority & Fraternity Life touts 29 recognized social organizations and four governing councils. The community stands at nearly 3,000 members, which represents roughly 12% of the undergraduate population on the Athens Campus.

Survivor Advocacy Program

A valued resource on campus, the Survivor Advocacy Program provides confidential support and advocacy services to student survivors of sexual assault, sexual harassment, dating/domestic violence, and stalking. Its work aims to increase student survivors' access to support and resources through survivor-centered advocacy and empowerment.




Well-Being & Recreation



Vice President for Student Affairs

Position Summary

Ohio University invites applications and nominations for the position of Vice President for Student Affairs (hereafter VPSA).

With its historic main campus in Athens; five regional campuses; three extension campuses in the Columbus, Cleveland, and Dayton areas; and one of the largest enrollments of online students among public universities in Ohio, the University has a collective enrollment of over 33,000 students. The stunning 1,740-acre main campus is located in what has been named one of America's best college towns. The campus seamlessly merges with Uptown Athens, which is rich with local food culture and walking distance from historic neighborhoods. Established by the Northwest Ordinance of 1787 and chartered in 1804, Ohio University is the state's first institution of higher education and one of America's oldest public universities. Today, OHIO is classified as a research university with high research activity by the Carnegie Foundation.

Key Responsibilities

The Vice President for Student Affairs (VPSA) reports to the President and with a strong commitment to equity and social justice will lead, promote, and direct an accomplished, dynamic, and respected student affairs division.

Specifically, the position provides leadership and oversight in the following areas:

- Assist University leaders in achieving the OHIO mission of advancing the intellectual and personal development of OHIO students.
- Manage a portfolio of more than 2.4M square feet of space and a total budget exceeding \$93M. This includes \$79M in auxiliary spending and University funded departments account for \$14M of the overall budget.
- · Actively engage with the University senior leadership team to set University policies and capital and facility planning.
- Oversee programs, services, and facilities designed to create a supportive learning environment that is strategically aligned with the University's strategic plan.
- Provide oversight of the Division of Student Affairs, including 12 departments, ~300 professional and graduate staff, and 2000+ student employees.

- Lead student success and student engagement initiatives in partnership with academic partners supporting retention, persistence, and graduation outcomes.
- Guide a high functioning leadership team.
- Operationalize diversity, equity and inclusion efforts across the Division of Student Affairs.
- Create and maintain partnership with a broad array of internal and external constituents.
- Initiate and implement student success projects, which facilitate and improve the financial, administrative and service productivity for Division of Student Affairs units.

Qualifications

Qualifications for this position include an earned doctorate at the time of appointment, a record of dynamic and visionary accomplishments with a deep understanding of the mission and functions of student affairs in a large comprehensive university, and experience working collaboratively with campus partners. Successful candidates will bring to the position a high degree of energy and integrity while inspiring a shared vision; an advocate and champion for student success; experience in strategic planning and financial management including budget and resource development; innovative leader who develops creative solutions within a complex institutional infrastructure; the ability to work with diverse constituents; knowledge of student development theory, current issues, and trends in student affairs; interest in external fundraising; experience in designing, undertaking, and applying an assessment based approach to Student Affairs programming and practices; extensive supervisory experience; and excellent interpersonal and written/oral communication skills.


