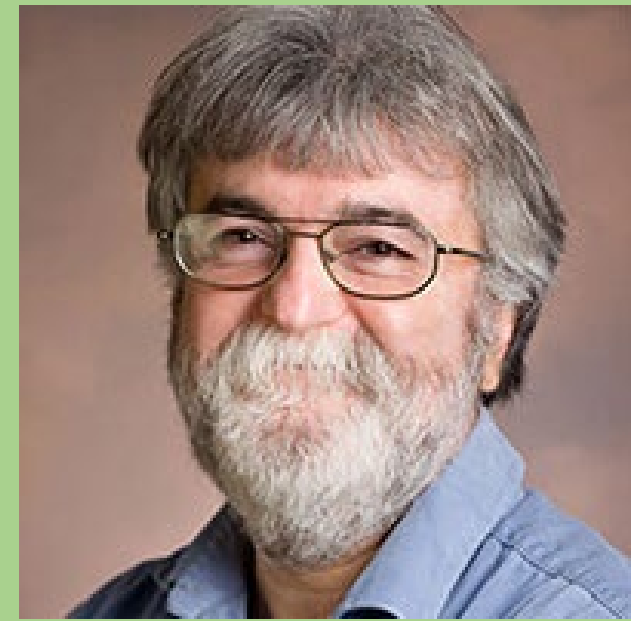


**Desired Output and Actual Network Output**

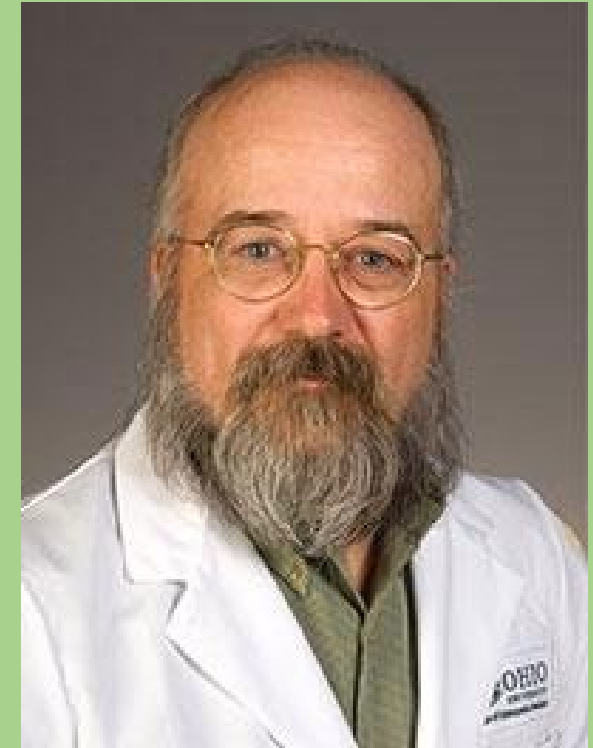
