Therefore, it is strongly recommended that students fulfill graduation requirements at their high school. However, once a CC+ student has officially registered for a course they will not be displaced.

Participants in the CC+ program are encouraged to work closely with their college advisor and high school counselors to assure that they are taking the proper courses, including those necessary for high school graduation credit.
