### Notice:

The high school graduation requirements listed in column HS REQS are not official and are met for planning purposes only. The responsibility for determining whether a college course satisfies a high school graduation requirement rests with the student's school district. Students should consult with their school counselor before finalizing their college course schedule. Transfer options listed for Lancaster High School partner institutions are based on availability at Lancaster High School and state transfer policies.

Not all courses listed are guaranteed to be offered on all of Ohio University's campuses or available online every semester. Please plan ahead by working with your academic advisor to create a schedule based on available course offerings.

Admission to CC+ does not guarantee availability of or admission to specific courses. In accordance with the Ohio Revised Code, Ohio University must take care to give registration priority to its degree-seeking students while attempting to provide CC+ students with reasonable class choices. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that students fulfill graduation requirements at their high school. However, once a CC+ student has officially registered for a course they will not be displaced.

Participants in the CC+ program are encouraged to work closely with their college advisor and high school counselors to assure that they are taking the proper courses, including those necessary for high school graduation credit.

Completion of these courses does not guarantee admission into the nursing program. Students must meet all the admission requirements for the BSN program to be considered for program admission. Students should apply in the spring for program admission in the fall.

Students must maintain a college GPA of 2.75 or higher to be considered for admission to the BSN nursing program.

Students must achieve a grade of "C" or better in **all** BSN prerequisite and support courses.

Students must take an algebra course in high school or college to be considered for admission to the BSN program.
