Roderick J. McDavis is the 20th president of Ohio University. A native of Dayton, Ohio, he received a bachelor's degree in social sciences in secondary education from Ohio University in 1970, making him only the second university alumnus to lead the university as president. He received a master's degree in student personnel administration from the University of Dayton in 1971, and a doctorate in counselor education and higher education administration from the University of Toledo in 1974.

Prior to joining Ohio University, Dr. McDavis served as provost and vice president for academic affairs and professor of education at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Va. He has served as chair of the Board of Directors of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (AACTE). He has authored or co-authored chapters in books, monographs and articles in professional journals and other publications.

He has served as a consultant and keynote speaker for universities, community colleges, public school systems, human service agencies, professional associations, community organizations, and churches.

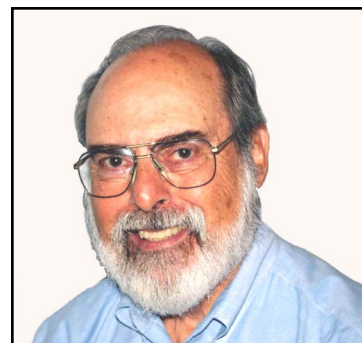

IN MEMORIAM



Margaret Deppen, 100, died April 21 at Lindley Inn in The Plains. Born in Ft. Wayne IN, she was a graduate of St. Augustine Academy, earned a BA degree from St. Mary of the Woods College and a master's degree in education from Indiana University.

She was with the USO in the US and Brazil during WWII, and a Red Cross worker in Korea during the Korean War.

Margaret came to OU as assistant dean of women in 1952, becoming dean in 1953. She became director of student organizations in 1966, continuing until her retirement in 1975. She was instrumental in the development of our Emeriti Park.

She was on Athens City Council from 1977 through 1981. She was an avid golfer, a dedicated walker and a formidable bridge player. She traveled extensively throughout the US and abroad.



Donald E. Perry, 91, of Athens, died April 5 at O'Bleness Memorial Hospital. Born in North Fairfield, he graduated from North Fairfield High School and OU, received a master's degree from OU and a doctorate from Bradley University. He spent 4 years as a high school teacher and basketball coach, served as a physical conditioning instructor in the army during WWII, and was on the faculty at OU for 27 years, 2 of those years being spent as a specialist in technical education for the Ministry of Education in Enugu, Nigeria.

He is survived by 1 daughter, 3 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.
