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Information for Individuals with Special 2022 Tax Filing Considerations:

Unexpired 2022 Tax Filing Extension

An individual who is required to file a 2022 federal income tax return and has been granted a filing extension by the IRS, must provide all of the following documents:

- A signed statement the sources of any 2022 income and the amount of income from each source;
- A copy of IRS Form 4868, "Application for Automatic Extension of Time to File U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," filed with the IRS for tax year 2022.
- A copy of the IRS's approval of an extension beyond the six-month extension for tax year 2022.
- Verification of Non-filing Letter (confirmation that the tax return has not yet been filed) from the IRS dated on or after October 1, 2023.
- Copy of all W-2 forms for each source of income received for tax year 2022.
- If self-employed, a signed statement certifying the amount of the individual's Adjusted Gross Income and the U.S. income tax paid for tax year 2022.

Amended 2022 Tax Return

An individual who filed an amended IRS income tax return for tax year 2022 must provide a signed copy of the 2022 IRS Form 1040X, "Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," that was filed with the IRS or documentation from the IRS that include the change(s) made by the IRS, in addition to one of the following:

- Updated income and tax information from the IRS on an ISIR record with all tax information from the original tax return;
- A **2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript** (that will only include information from the original tax return and does not have to be signed), or any other IRS tax transcript(s) that includes all of the income and tax information required to be verified; or
- A signed copy of the 2022 IRS Form 1040 and the applicable schedules that were filed with the IRS.

Victim of IRS Tax-Related Identity Theft

An individual who is a victim of tax-related identity theft, must provide all of the following documents:

- A Tax Return DataBase View (TRDBV) transcript obtained from the IRS or, if unable to obtain a TRDBV, an equivalent document provided by the IRS or a copy of the signed 2022 income tax return and applicable schedules the individual filed with the IRS; **and**
- A statement signed and dated by the tax filer indicating that he or she was a victim of IRS tax related identity theft and that the IRS is aware of the tax-related identity theft.
