- In reference to Britney Hamman's denial of Conflict of Interest (COI) case in last month's meeting
  - Britney was admitted to the DNP program and appealed the COI policy
  - ii. The CHSP and provost approved an exemption to the COI policy
  - iii. Future appeals should include input from Graduate Council (GC) as part of the appeals process
  - iv. The GC is responsible for mitigating any aspect of conflicts
    - Britney's registration is on hold until a mitigation plan is in place
